*The University of Washington has an outstanding opportunity available for a full-time (0.9-1.0 FTE) **Advance Practice Provider** to serve as a key member of our Palliative Care Consultation Service. The palliative care ARNP/PA is a member of the University of Washington Medical Center palliative care consultative team providing palliative care consultation to medical teams, patients and families, nursing and social services, and spiritual care staff. As a member of the UWMC palliative care team, the advance practice provider will be responsible for providing palliative care independently and collaboratively with appropriate privileges, including initial and ongoing assessment, diagnosis and treatment of patient's medical, physical and psychosocial status.*

RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE:

- Maintaining excellent interpersonal skills using narrative medicine to execute the UWMC Palliative Care Best Practice Model
- Providing clinical consultation in all the domains of palliative care (patient/family/provider communication, goals of care, pain and symptom management, end-of-life care planning)
- Participating in holiday coverage and rare prn weekend coverage for the palliative care consultation service
- Collaborating with primary teams
- Educating Fellows, Residents, UW medical students, ARNP & PA students, as well as UWMC staff on all aspects of palliative care
- Assisting in palliative care program development of innovative policies, protocols, and procedures using an evidence based approach to improve quality, safety, and value of palliative care

REQUIREMENTS:

Current and valid (or eligible for) licensure as an ARNP or PA in Washington State
 Graduate degree from an accredited Nurse Practitioner program or PA program Nationally certified ARNP or PA with DEA
 Minimum of 1-2 years of experience working in Palliative Care / Hospice
 Effective interpersonal skills, leadership skills, & clinical expertise in the care of patients with life-limiting illness
 Previous experience in critical care, cardiac or oncology care is helpful
